
James Henderson [1st] of Fordell – Three piles issuant from sinister on a chief a crescent between two ermine spots. (Seal, 1497 [Stevenson 2: 409])



James Henderson [1st] of Fordell – Three piles issuant from dexter on a chief a crescent between four ermine spots, two and two. (Seal, 1506 [Stevenson 2:410])



[James] Henderson [3rd] of Fordell – Parted per pale dancetty Or and Sable, on a chief Argent a crescent between two ermine spots Azure. (Late addition, ca. 1560, to Sir David Lindsay's Armorial, 1542)




[James] Henderson [3rd] of Fordell — Per pale dancetty Sable and Argent on a chief Argent a crescent Vert between two ermine spots. (Queen Mary's Roll, 1562)




[James] Henderson of Fordell – Sable three piles issuant from dexter Or on a chief Argent a crescent [Azure or Vert?] between two ermine spots Sable. (Workman's MS, 1565-66)



[James] Henderson [3rd of Fordell] – Argent three piles issuant from dexter flank and on a chief Sable a crescent Or between two Ermines spots. (Slains Armorial, ca 1567)



[James] Henderson [3rd] of Fordell – Gules three piles issuant from dexter flank and on a chief Argent a crescent Azure between two Ermine spots. (Seton Armorial, 1591; also on his seal, 1592, without indication of tinctures)



[James] Henderson [3rd of Fordell] – Argent [probably an error for Or] three piles issuant from dexter flank Sable and on a chief Argent a crescent Vert between two Ermine spots. (Dunvegan Armorial, ca 1600)




[James] Henderson [3rd] of Fordell – Or three piles issuant from the dexter edge on a chief Argent a crescent Azure between two ermine spots Sable. (Lord Crawford's Armorial, 1601)



[Sir John] Henderson [5th] of Fordell – Per pale indented [or dancetty] Sable and Or on a chief Argent a crescent Gules between two ermine spots Sable. (Balfour's MS, 1630-54)



Henderson of Fordell (3rd quarter for Sir William Lockhart, Lord Advocate) - Parted per pale indented sable and argent on a chief gules a crescent or betwixt two tufts of ermine as the second. (Lyon Reg, ca. 1690)




[Sir John] Henderson [3rd Bt] of Fordell – Gules three piles issuing from the sinister, on a chief Argent a crescent Azure between two ermine spots. (Nisbet, 1722; 1838 bookplate of Sir Robert Bruce Henderson, 6th Bt of Fordell; BGA 1865, for Henderson-Mercer of Fordell)




Henderson of Fordell – Parted per pale dancetty Or and Sable, on a chief Argent a crescent Azure between two ermine spots Sable. (Lyon Reg, 1882, as 1st quarter for Hew A. D. H. Haldane-Duncan Mercer-Henderson; Lyon Reg, 1985, to Dr. William Philip Henderson of Fordell)




William Henryson (d. 1582), Treasurer of Orkney – Three piles issuing from the dexter side [?] (On his tombstone at St. Magnus Cathedral; H. L. Norton Smith, *A Collection of Armorials of the County of Orkney* (Galashiels, 1902), pp. 66-69 and plate 18)



Henryson (Orkney) - per pale, in dexter three piles issuing from dexter, in sinister a crescent reversed, and overall a chief ermine (Carved panel on the bishop's throne at Graemeshall, Orkney; Norton Smith, p. 69)



Sir Thomas Henryson, Lord Chesters – Three piles issuant from dexter, in sinister a rose, a chief parted per fess charged in the lower half with a crescent between two ermine spots. (On his book stamp, c. 1635)




Henderson of Chesters – Parted per pale pily Sable and Argent on the last a rose Gules, on a chief of the last a crescent between two ermine spots Or. (Robson, 1830)



Henry Henderson of St. Lawrence, M.D. – Parted per pale indented Sable and Argent two attires of a hart transposed paleways and counterchanged, on a chief Gules a crescent Or between as many ermine spots [Argent?]. (Lyon Reg 1/326 [1672/76]; Nisbet, 1722)




George Henderson, Mayor of Newcastle upon Tyne – Barry pily of ten Or and Sable, a chief Ermine. (Recorded in Robert Carr's MS Catalogue of the Mayors and Sheriffs of Newcastle, 1730, in W. H. D. Longstaffe, ed, *Visitation of the Northern Counties*, Surtees Soc 41 (Durham, 1863), p. lxxvi)




Alexander Henderson of Eildon Hall, banker in Edinburgh – Parted per pale indented Or and Sable three roundels in fess counterchanged. (Lyon Reg, 1825)



[Walter?] Henderson of Granton [fl. ca. 1600?] – Parted per pale pily Argent and Sable a bordure of the first, on a chief Gules a crescent between two ermine spots Or. (Robson, 1830)




Henderson, Liverpool – Gules three piles issuing from the sinister Argent a bordure quarterly of the first and Ermine, on a chief Argent a crescent Azure between two ermine spots Sable. (Robson, 1830)




[Alexander] Henderson [of Press], Lord Provost of Edinburgh – Gules three piles issuing from the sinister Argent each charged with a heart, on the dexter side four mullets in pale of the second, on a chief of the same a crescent Azure between two ermine spots Sable. (Robson, 1830)




[Charles Cooper] Henderson, Chertsey, Surrey – Gules three piles issuing from the sinister Argent a chief Ermine. (Robson, 1830; per Fox-Davies 1895, used by Col (later Maj Gen) Kenneth Gregg Henderson, CB (b. 1836), but not matriculated. Charles Cooper Henderson was his father.)



Henderson – Gules three piles issuing from the sinister Argent a bordure Or, on a chief of the second a crescent Vert between two ermine spots Sable. (Robson, 1830)



Henrieson – Gules three piles issuing from the sinister Argent, the under one charged with a crescent Vert between two ermine spots Sable. (Robson, 1830)




Rev Gilbert Henderson Phillips, Brodsworth, Yorks – (4th quarter) Gules three piles issuant from sinister within a bordure Or, on a chief Ermine a crescent Azure. (Coll of Arms, 1863)




Mitchell Henry, Kylemore Lodge, Letterfrack, co. Galway – Per pale indented Argent and Gules on the dexter side a rose of the second; a chief Azure charged with a lion passant of the first. (Ulster Grants G/23 [1863])



Robert Henderson, Randalls Park, Surrey – Gules three piles issuing from the sinister Or, a chief engrailed Ermine. (Lyon Reg, 1865)



Maj (later Maj Gen) **John William Cleland Henderson**, Roke Manor, Hants. – (1st and 4th quarters) Ermine three piles, two in chief and one in base, Gules, each charged with a crescent Argent, on a chief of the second three estoiles of the third. (Coll of Arms, 1869; Lyon Reg, 1882)



Thomas Henderson, merchant, Glasgow – Argent three piles issuing from the sinister Sable, on a chief wavy Azure an anchor between two crescents of the first. (Lyon Reg, 1872)

Christopher Hope Henderson-Roe, Upper Macclesfield, Cheshire – [blazon unknown] (Coll of Arms, 1879)




Arthur Henderson of Williamfield, Ayr – Sable three piles issuing from the sinister Argent, on a chief Or a mullet Azure between two ermine spots. (Lyon Reg, 1885)



Sir William Henderson, Lord Provost of Aberdeen – Azure three piles Or, in base a tower triple-towered Argent, masoned Sable, doors and windows Gules, on a chief Ermine a crescent of the first between two spur-revels of six points of the third. (Lyon Reg, 1892)



Col George Henderson, Heverswood, Kent – Gules three piles issuing from the sinister Or, a chief embattled Ermine. (Lyon Reg, 1893)



Richard Henderson, Glasgow – Argent three piles issuing from the sinister Sable, on a chief indented Azure two olive branches wreathed surrounding one in pale between two crescents of the first. (Lyon Reg, 1895)




Henderson of Hallyards (4th quarter for Thomas Clayhills-Henderson of Invergowrie) – Argent three piles issuing from the dexter Sable, on a chief Ermine a crescent Gules between two mullets Or and in a canton Azure, on a chevron between three mascles Or a boar's head erased Azure in the middle chief a fleur-de-lis Or. (Lyon Reg, 1896)



James Alexander Henryson-Caird, Cassencary, Kirkcudbright – Gules three piles issuing from the sinister Argent, on a chief Sable three garbs Or. (Lyon Reg, 1897)



Sir James Henderson, Lord Mayor of Belfast – Per pale indented Gules and Or, on a chief Vair a crescent between two bells of the second. (Ulster Grants J/47 [1899])



Sir Alexander Henderson, Bt, Buscot Park, Berks (later 1st Baron Faringdon) – Or three piles issuing from the sinister Vert, on a chief Ermine three torteaux. (Lyon Reg 17/20 [1902])



V. Rev. William George Henderson, Dean of Carlisle – Parted per bend indented Sable and Or, on a chief Argent a rose Gules barbed and seeded Vert between two ermine spots. (Lyon Reg 17/68 [1904])




Mary Augusta Walcott Henderson, Maud Henderson, Isabel Grace Henderson, Ida Henderson, Beatrice Henderson, and Mabel Henderson – Parted per bend indented Sable and Or, on a chief Argent a rose Gules barbed and seeded Vert between two ermine spots, a bordure Gules. (Lyon Reg 17/71 [1904])



Francis Henderson, Dumbartonshire and Glasgow – Gules three piles issuing from the sinister Argent on a chief Or, in a sea undy Azure and of the second a Norse galley Vert in full sail and armed proper flagged Gules. (Lyon Reg 20/66 [1910])



Maj John Acheson Henderson of Drumlamph, co. Derry – Per pale dancetty Or and Sable, on a chief Argent a crescent Azure. (Ulster Grants K/95 [1912])



Archibald John Pitcairn Henderson, Glasgow – Argent three piles issuing from the sinister Sable, on a chief Azure a crescent between two lozenges of the first. (Lyon Reg 23/66 [1918])



Sir Thomas Henderson, Roxburghshire – Or three piles issuing from the sinister Gules, on a chief of the last a golden fleece between two fleurs-de-lis of the field. (Lyon Reg 24/21 [1919])



William Craig Henderson – Argent three piles issuing from the dexter Sable,on a chief Ermine a portcullis proper chained Or between two hunting horns Vert garnished and stringed Gules. (Lyon Reg 34/6 [1940])




John Cochrane Henderson – Azure1Fi three piles, on a chief of the last an Aesculapian rod accompanied by two thistles slipped all proper and in base a boar's head erased of the second. (Lyon Reg 35/4 [1944])



Maj Ronald Henry White Henderson – Or three piles issuing from the sinister Vert on a chief invected Ermine three torteaux. (Lyon Reg 35/66 [1946])



Thomas Sinclair Thyne Henderson, USA - Or three piles issuing from the sinister Gules, on a chief of the last a golden fleece between two fleurs-de-lis of the field, all within a bordure of the first for difference. (Lyon Reg 36/28 [1947])




Granton Holston Henderson, Rosemont, Pa. – Gules a wreath of twisted Silver and Sable beset in cross with four hawk's bells gold, within an orle of martlets silver. (Coll of Arms, 1953)




John Kenneth Henderson – Gules three piles issuing from sinister Or, a chief engrailed Ermine charged in dexter chief with a crescent Sable for difference. (Lyon Reg 43/126 [1960])



Sir Ian Leslie Henderson – (1st & 4th quarters) Sable three piles issuing from sinister Or, on a chief Ermine a crescent Azure, all within a bordure engrailed Gules. (Lyon Reg 47/118 [1965])



John Crombie Henderson - Argent three piles issuing from the sinister Sable, on a chief engrailed Azure a crescent between two lozenges of the first. (Lyon Reg 54/44 [1969])



James Henderson – Argent three piles issuing from the sinister Sable, on a chief invected Gules a pale Ermine of one spot between two cushions Or. (Lyon Reg 52/62 [1970])



Robert Henderson, Havana, Cuba – Gules three piles issuing from sinister Or on a chief Ermine a crescent between two locomotive wheels Gules. (Lyon Reg, 1977; CHI Grants X/21 [1991])



Filiberto Jesús Robustiano Henderson, Charlotte, N.C. – Gules three piles issuant from sinister Or on a chief engrailed Ermine a crescent between two locomotive wheels Gules. (Lyon Reg 58/98 [1977])



Mark Anthony Henderson, Manassas, Virginia – Sable three chevronels issuant from sinister braced Or on a chief Argent a lion rampant between two fleurs-de-lis Gules. (Assumed, 2014)
